



McLennan County Aquifers

The aquifers and alluvium deposits that are included within the Southern Trinity Groundwater Conservation district include the Trinity Aquifer and the Brazos River Alluvium. The Trinity Aquifer is classified as a major aquifer, while the Brazos River Alluvium are classified as minor. Major aquifers are over much larger areas than minor aquifers and produce larger amounts of water. The Trinity Aquifer has been pumped heavily and is considered a primary groundwater management area. Thanks to the regulation of groundwater conservation districts and well owners, the lifespan of the aquifer has been extended.
